



# Information Notice to Trade

## Correct GB Export Health Certificate Completion

The Sea-Fisheries Protection Authority has issued this Information Notice in relation to technical requirements for Irish companies trading with Great Britain in an evolving third country regulatory environment.

*From 00:01 a.m on the 31<sup>st</sup> of January 2024, consignments of Irish medium and high risk fish, fishery products and molluscan shellfish with a final destination in Great Britain or transiting the GB landbridge en route to a final destination in mainland Europe will require Export Health Certificates (EHCs).*

Export Health Certification of consignments for final destination GB and transit across GB will be provided via TRACES.

All exporting FBOs who will require EHCs for trade with GB should complete the Industry training on TRACES provided by DAFM at [this link](#).

1. When inputting your details into field I.1 Consignor, if you are registered for multiple activities, please be sure to select the 'Processing Plant' with your SFPA approval number and 'FFP Fishery products – EU' for insertion into this field. See example below.

2. In field I.15 Means of Transport, if the vehicle registration is unknown at time of submitting part one of the EHC you can submit TBC/Groupage as applicable. This can be updated prior to certification. Current indications given by UK authorities is that the correct registration must be available on IPAFFS pre-notification entry done by GB importer, but not necessarily on the EHC. See examples below.
